SPORT – Kwik Cricket	
ELIGIBILITY	
Age Group	<p>School Years: 5 & 6</p> <p>The event is aimed at year 5 and 6 students. Younger aged students are able to participate at the discretion of the Team Manager.</p>
Eligibility	<p>Only school teams can enter the competition (not representative school teams).</p> <p>Established Club Teams are NOT eligible.</p>
TEAM REQUIREMENTS - Year 5/6 Girls	
Team size on the day	6 players in a team
Squad size on the day	Squad size of 8 players with 6 players selected for each match
Substitutes	2 Players can be substituted in the case of injury and after each match in a competition
TEAM REQUIREMENTS - Year 5/6 Mixed	
Team size on the day	8 players in a team. Any mixture of combinations are acceptable i.e. all boys, all girls, mixture of boys and girls
Squad size on the day	Squad size of 10 players with 8 players selected for each match
Substitutes	2 Players can be substituted in the case of injury and after each match in a competition
EVENT FORMAT & RULES	
Event to be played to ECBs Kwik Cricket Rules	<p>This will include the removal of all jewellery. Players infringing these rules once a match has started must leave the field to remove jewellery etc while play will continue.</p> <p>Pitch: The pitch length should be 16 yards</p> <p>Equipment: Kwik Cricket equipment must be used, WCB can provide to schools</p> <p>Officials: Each school is responsible for providing a scorer and an umpire. Waiting batters can act as scorers/umpires.</p> <p>Overs: The number of overs per match will depend on the number of teams and pitches. It is recommended that each innings are 8 overs</p>

Kwik Cricket (cont.)



<p>Format of competition</p>	<p>Round robin format of appropriately sized pools.</p> <p>Points awarded within the round robin competition as follows:</p> <p>5 points for a win 3 points for a draw 1 points for a loss</p> <p>It is recognised that this points system may differ at a cluster/ partnership competition.</p>
<p>Team/player no show rules during competition</p>	<p>If the team has 6 players the game will start.</p> <p>Late arrivals can join the match at the discretion of the tournament organiser and/or the umpire(s).</p>
<p>Infringement of Min/max number in team</p>	<p>If more than 8 players or ineligible (Yr 5/6 Girls) or 10 players or ineligible (Yr 5/6 Mixed) players are brought, they will not be allowed to play. Teams must declare the 8 (Yr 5/6 Girls) or 10 (Yr 5/6 Mixed) eligible players who will be involved in the tournament on arrival.</p> <p>If ineligible players are played then the team will be disqualified from the competition.</p>
<p>Infringement of code of conduct</p>	<p>The umpires in accordance with the ECBs Kwik Cricket rules will deal with any infringement of rules during play. Any other infringement will be dealt with in accordance with the overall tournament rules.</p>
<p>Grievance procedures</p>	<p>If these relate to the sport specific tournament they must be made to the Tournament Organiser.</p>
<p>Timescale for Competition</p>	<p>May - Mid-June: Partnership finals to be completed Last Week in June: County Finals, Trowbridge CC.</p>

Rules of the game



Normal Cricket Rules Apply Except:

Batting

- The batting side will be divided into pairs, each pair batting for 2 overs, with a new pair starting at the end of the second, fourth and sixth over.
- A batter may be out bowled, caught, run out, stumped or hit wicket.
- There is **NO** LBW law unless the batter deliberately blocks the ball with a leg or foot.

Bowling

- Each player on the fielding side **MUST** bowl 1 over.
- Bowling will take place from one end only.
- Bowling should be over arm where possible.

Scoring

- Each team starts with a score of 200 runs.
- Each time a batter is out, 5 runs are deducted and the other batter of the pair faces the next ball.
- Runs will be scored in the normal way, as will byes.
- 2 runs will be awarded to the batting team for each wide ball and no-ball bowled, but no extra ball will be allocated, except in the final over of each innings when, in addition to the 2 runs, an extra ball will be bowled.

Young Cricket Leaders Award



Age requirements 16 years or older.

Time requirements 6 hours cricket skills and games – delivered as 1x6 hour or 2x3 hour.

Course description: The course aims to enable young leaders (16-18) to help introduce cricket to primary school aged children. The young person will be able to:

- Plan a safe, organised and effective cricket session for primary school aged children.
- Deliver a safe, organised and effective cricket session for young people under direct supervision.
- Gain knowledge and understanding of small sided games.
- Identify and progress skills into small sided games.
- Plan local cricket festivals/tournaments for 7-11 year olds.
- Deliver and implement cricket festivals/tournaments for 7-11 year olds.
- Use appropriate resources to support sessions.
- Identify where to go next as a coach and gain the required support and advise.
- Identify key personnel at local clubs (e.g. junior section organiser).

Delivery Requirements (i.e. Who can deliver the course and what qualifications / training do they need?)

Minimum Staff Coach Level 1.

Resources produced / required for delivery

- ECB Coaching Cards.
- Making Cricket Fun.
- Inter Cricket Information Pack.
- Kwik Cricket Information Pack.
- ECB Coaches Code of Conduct.

What does the young person obtain? (e.g. certificate)

The young person will be awarded a certificate on completion.

What is the most appropriate next step in terms of obtaining further awards?

One of the outcomes of this course is the ability to identify where to go next.

Does the award have to be renewed after a certain period?
